



Terms of Use – ACLEI Twitter account

ACLEI **does not** accept or handle reports of corruption via Twitter. Anyone wishing to report a corruption issue to ACLEI should do so in accordance with the [instructions available on our website](#) or by calling (02) 6141 2345.

The following terms of use apply to the ACLEI Twitter account. An individual or entity that posts or contributes to the ACLEI Twitter account agrees to abide by these terms of use.

ACLEI uses Twitter to share information on:

- a) corruption prevention resources and research;
- b) publically available investigation reports;
- c) media releases; and
- d) other content as approved by the Integrity Commissioner on a case-by-case basis.

Except for the content provided by ACLEI, any content, views, opinions and responses to questions or views uploaded, expressed or submitted by the creators, sponsors, advertisers or users of the ACLEI Twitter account, are solely the views, opinions and responsibility of the person submitting them and do not necessarily reflect the opinions of ACLEI or the Australian Government.

ACLEI does not respond to individual tweets and does not automatically follow back new followers. Being followed back or re-tweeted does not imply endorsement of any kind by ACLEI or the Australian Government.

ACLEI reserves the sole right to review, edit and/or delete any comments it deems are inappropriate. Comments including, but not limited to, the following may be deleted or edited by the moderators:

- a) inappropriate language (e.g. profanity, racial, ethnic or gender-based language as well as offensive abbreviations, or letter substitutions)
- b) abusive comments, personal attacks, (including personality or ideological clashes between posters) or defamatory statements about another social media user, another person, ACLEI or its staff
- c) anything that could be considered prejudicial, vexatious or offensive
- d) spam, irrelevant comments, or links to appeals, petitions, offers, events, groups, pages, websites, organisations which are not related to ACLEI;
- e) comments that violate the privacy of people including ACLEI staff, members of the public, subject officers or witnesses, law enforcement or government agency officers; and
- f) comments which are illegal or likely to impact our operations.

Any posts or comments in response to our posts that contradict these terms of use may be removed. Repeated inappropriate posts or comments may result in the offending party/ies being blocked from the ACLEI Twitter account.
